## **WSCA Legislative Update**

The Legislature is already two weeks in to the 2023 legislative session, and while the flood of bill introductions is beginning to slow, members of the House and Senate are still introducing more than two dozen bills every day. The first deadline for bills to be advanced from their committee of origin is still four weeks away, so expect the list of bills we're tracking to continue to grow.

This week the Senate Early Learning & K-12 Education Committee passed SB 5019 on a party-line vote. This legislation would remove "classified staff providing student and staff safety" (example: School Resource Officers) from the definition of physical, social, and emotional support staff, which were adopted in 2SHB 1664 by the 2022 Legislature. Concerns about the inclusion of SROs in this proposed funding increase were raised by some groups during the rulemaking to implement HB 1664 last year. WSCA does not have a position on SROs, and therefore did not provide public comment on this proposal. The WEA, League of Education Voters, OSPI and the Association of Social Workers supported the bill. Public School Employees of Washington and some school districts and Directors testified with concerns. The bill moved to the Rules Committee.

Next week, Education committees in both chambers will hear the "universal school meals" proposal put forth by Representatives Marcus Riccelli (D-Spokane) and Senator T'wina Nobles (D-Lakewood), at the request of State Superintendent Chris Reykdal. This legislation proposes to include the provision of school meals in the definition of basic education, to allow all students to receive breakfast and lunch at school.
