WSCA Legislative Update

- House and Senate Education committees heard compelling public testimony last week about the proposal to provide universal free meals to all Washington K-12 students. The proposal, which will cost more than \$85 million per year, would provide no-cost meals to 1.1 million students across the state. WSCA supports this legislation, which is scheduled for executive action in both committees next week.
- Legislation proposing to expand the school year from 180 to 185 days is being heard in the Senate Early Learning & K-12 Education Committee next week.
- Competing versions of legislation to update High School & Beyond Plans are moving through the Legislature this session; the House version is scheduled for a hearing next and the Senate version is scheduled to be voted out of committee.
- Legislation to expand graduation pathway options has not been scheduled for a hearing in the House Education committee yet.
- The first cutoff of the session is 3 weeks away (Feb. 17th)
