WSCA Legislative Update

This was the last full week of committee hearings for the first half of the 2023 legislative session. Committees will shift into executive sessions next week (although there will still be a few hearings), and any bill not voted out of its committee of origin by 5 p.m. on Friday, February 17th is likely dead for this session.

WSCA testified in favor of HB 1308 this week, legislation to provide expanded graduation pathways for students. Although there was a great deal of support from the bill, business leaders in the Washington Roundtable opposed the bill in testimony. The sponsor, Rep. Monica Stonier, is committed to advancing legislation to give students more options in pursuing their education in ways that are relevant to them. The bill is scheduled for executive action next week.

After next week's committee cutoff, the Legislature will spend a week in fiscal committee hearings where they will hear and pass bills with an impact on the state budget. The deadline for bills to move from fiscal committee is Friday, February 24th.
