WSCA Legislative Update

House and Senate fiscal committees worked long hours last week considering legislation with a tax or budget impact, in advance of the fiscal cut-off deadline on Friday (2/24). The House Appropriations Committee concluded their work just before 5 p.m. Friday and the Senate Ways & Means Committee met until 7 p.m. as they continued negotiating on bills right up until they adjourned. There were 56 bills on the final Ways & Means Committee agenda, but the Chair declined to take action on 18 of them, rendering those bills effectively "dead" for this year.

Action shifts to the floor next week as the House and Senate work to pass as many bills as they can by the next deadline, which is 5 p.m., Wednesday, March 8. House bills must be passed to the Senate and viceversa in order to remain viable for this session.

- HB 1308, the graduation pathways bill, is awaiting a vote on the House floor after advancing from the Rules committee last Wednesday.
- Legislation to require the use of a single online platform for high school & beyond plans, 2SSB 5243, is in the Senate Rules Committee.
- Bills expanding access to dual credit programs in schools are continuing to advance.
- Special Education funding bills advanced in the House and Senate; SSB 5311 and SHB 1436 were both voted out of their fiscal committees last week.
- Legislation to provide universal free school meals passed out of the Appropriations committee Friday with bipartisan support. The bill no longer includes free school meals as part of the definition of basic education, and only applies to elementary schools with a free-and-reduced lunch population of 30% or greater.
- Legislation to eliminate the use of isolation & restraint in schools passed out of the Appropriations committee Friday on a mostly party-line vote. There were nearly 20 amendments initially proposed for SHB 1479, but after a robust committee debate, many were withdrawn and supporters pledged to initiate meaningful stakeholder discussions on the bill.
